

## 11:20-22, Faith that Confesses to Others

#### The Promise to Abraham

Gen 12:1 Now the LORD had said unto Abram,
Get thee out of thy country, and from thy kindred, and from thy father's house, unto a land that I will shew thee:

2 And I will make of thee a great nation,

and I will bless thee, and make thy name great; and be thou a blessing:

3 And I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee: and in thee shall all families of the earth be blessed.

## 11:20-22, Faith that Confesses

#### Isaac to Jacob and Esau

Jacob: Gen. 27:27 And he came near, and kissed him: and he smelled the smell of his raiment, and blessed him, and said, See, the smell of my son is as the smell of a field which the LORD hath blessed: 28 Therefore God give thee of the dew of heaven, and the fatness of the earth, and plenty of corn and wine: 29 Let people serve thee, and nations bow down to thee: be lord over thy brethren, and let thy mother's sons bow down to thee: cursed be every one that curseth thee, and blessed be he that blesseth thee.

Esau: Gen. 27:39 And Isaac his father answered and said unto him, Behold, thy dwelling shall be the fatness of the earth, and of the dew of heaven from above; 40 And by thy sword shalt thou live, and shalt serve thy brother; and it shall come to pass when thou shalt have the dominion, that thou shalt break his yoke from off thy neck.

#### **Jacob to Joseph and his Sons:**

Worshipped ... staff: Gen. 47:29 And the time drew nigh that Israel must die: and he called his son Joseph, and said unto him, If now I have found grace in thy sight, put, I pray thee, thy hand under my thigh, and deal kindly and truly with me; bury me not, I pray thee, in Egypt: 30 But I will lie with my fathers, and thou shalt carry me out of Egypt, and bury me in their buryingplace. And he said, I will do as thou hast said. 31 And he said, Swear unto me. And he sware unto him. And Israel bowed himself/worshipped upon the bed's head. (LXX "staff")

Sons of Joseph: Gen. 48:15 And he blessed Joseph, and said, God, before whom my fathers Abraham and Isaac did walk, the God which fed me all my life long unto this day, 16 The Angel which redeemed me from all evil, bless the lads; and let my name be named on them, and the name of my fathers Abraham and Isaac; and let them grow into a multitude in the midst of the earth.


#### Joseph:

Gen. 50:24 And Joseph said unto his brethren, I die: and God will surely visit you, and bring you out of this land unto the land which he sware to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob. 25 And Joseph took an oath of the children of Israel, saying, God will surely visit you, and ye shall carry up my bones from hence.

# The Spiritual Lesson of the Exodus

Hos. 9:3 They shall not dwell in the LORD'S land; but Ephraim shall return to Egypt, and they shall eat unclean things in Assyria.

Jos 5:9 And the LORD said unto Joshua, This day have I rolled away the reproach [shame] of Egypt from off you. Wherefore the name of the place is called Gilgal unto this day.



Isa 52:4 For thus saith the Lord GOD, My people went down aforetime into Egypt to sojourn there; and the Assyrian oppressed them without cause. ... 11 Depart ye, depart ye, go ye out from thence, **touch no unclean thing**; go ye out of the midst of her; be ye clean, that bear the vessels of the LORD.

2Co 6:17 Wherefore **come out from among them,** and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you,

11:23 hid ... because they saw he was a **proper** child

Ex. 2:1 And there went a man of the house of Levi, and took to wife a daughter of Levi. 2 And the woman conceived, and bare a son: and when she saw him that he was a **goodly** child, she hid him three months.

Acts 7:20 In which time Moses was born, and was **exceeding fair (proper to God)**, and nourished up in his father's house three months:

11:24 **refused** to be called the **son of Pharaoh's** daughter

Ex. 2:10 And the child grew, and she brought him unto **Pharaoh's daughter**, and **he became her son**. And she called his name Moses: and she said, Because I drew him out of the water. 11 And it came to pass in those days, when Moses was grown, that **he went out unto his brethren**, and looked on their burdens: and he spied an Egyptian smiting an Hebrew, one of his brethren. 12 And he looked this way and that way, and when he saw that there was no man, he slew the Egyptian, and hid him in the sand.

Psa 89:50 Remember, Lord, the **reproach** of thy servants; how I do bear in my bosom the **reproach** of all the mighty people; 51 Wherewith thine enemies have reproached, O LORD; wherewith they have **reproached** the footsteps of **thine anointed**.

Zec 2:8 For thus saith the LORD of hosts; After the glory hath he sent me unto the nations which spoiled you: for he that toucheth you toucheth the apple of his eye.
