
Semantic Structure in Isa 53:5-6

The Context of 53:5b

53:5b the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed.

Peter's interpretation: 1Pe 2:24 Who his own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: by whose stripes ye were healed.

Isa 1:5 Why should ye be stricken any more? ye will revolt more and more: **the whole head is sick**, and the whole heart faint.

Isa 6:10 Make the heart of this people fat, and make their ears heavy, and shut their eyes; **lest they** see with their eyes, and hear with their ears, and understand with their heart, and convert, and **be healed**.

Isa 30:26 Moreover the light of the moon shall be as the light of the sun, and the light of the sun shall be sevenfold, as the light of seven days, in the day that the LORD bindeth up the breach of his people, and **healeth the stroke of their wound**.



53:6 "Laid on him" (Causative of פגע)

1Sa 22:13-19 And Saul said unto [Ahimelech], Why have ye conspired against me, thou and the son of Jesse, in that thou hast given him bread, and a sword, and hast enquired of God for him, that he should rise against me, to lie in wait, as at this day? ... 17 And the king said unto the footmen that stood about him, Turn, and slay the priests of the LORD; because their hand also is with David, and because they knew when he fled, and did not shew it to me. But the servants of the king would not put forth their hand to fall upon פגע the priests of the LORD. 18 And the king said to Doeg, Turn thou, and fall upon פגע the priests. And Doeg the Edomite turned, and he fell upon פגע the priests, and slew on that day fourscore and five persons that did wear a linen ephod.

Two Kinds of Sheep

Isa 53:6 All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way;

Isa 53:7 **he** is brought as a **lamb** to the slaughter, and as a **sheep** before her shearers is dumb, so **he** openeth not his mouth.

Heb 2:16-17 For verily he took not on him the nature of angels; but he took on him the seed of Abraham. 17 Wherefore in all things it behoved him to be made like unto his brethren, that he might be a merciful and faithful high priest in things pertaining to God, to make reconciliation for the sins of the people.

An alternative rendering of 53:8 AV:

Who shall declare his generation [object]?
