

Three Encouraging Quotations


- 11-17a Prosperity and Victory

"Fear Not" in the OT



Echoes of David

54:4 Fear ירא not; for thou shalt not be ashamed בושׁ:
neither be thou confounded כלם; for thou shalt not be put
to shame חפר

Psa 35:4 Let them be confounded בוש and put to shame that seek after my soul: let them be turned back and brought to confusion חפר that devise my hurt.

Psa 40:14 Let them be ashamed בושׁ and confounded non together that seek after my soul to destroy it; let them be driven backward and put to shame כלם that wish me evil.

Psa 70:2 Let them be ashamed בוש and confounded חפר and seek after my soul: let them be turned backward, and put to confusion כלם, that desire my hurt.

So who is put to shame?

Isa 1:29 For they shall be ashamed בושׁ of the oaks which ye have desired, and ye shall be confounded חפר for the gardens that ye have chosen.

Isa 41:11 Behold, all they that were incensed against thee shall be ashamed בושׁ and confounded כלם:

Isa 45:16 They shall be **ashamed** בושׁ, and also **confounded** כלם, all of them: they shall go to **confusion** כלמה together *that are* makers of idols.

"Thy Husband"

Origin: at Sinai (ca. 1400 BC)

Exo 34:13-16 But ye shall destroy their altars, break their images, and cut down their groves: 14 For thou shalt worship no other god: for the LORD, whose name is Jealous, is a jealous God: 15 Lest thou make a covenant with the inhabitants of the land, and they go a **whoring** after their gods, and do sacrifice unto their gods, and one call thee, and thou eat of his sacrifice; 16 And thou take of their daughters unto thy sons, and their daughters go a **whoring** after their gods, and make thy sons go a **whoring** after their gods.

Elaboration: Hosea (contemporary of Isaiah, ca. 700 BC)

Hos 2:2-20 Plead with your mother, plead: for **she is not my wife, neither am I her husband**: ... 7 And she shall follow after her lovers, but she shall not overtake them; and she shall seek them, but shall not find them: then shall she say, I will go and **return to my first husband**; for then was it better with me than now. ... 16 And it shall be at that day, saith the LORD, that thou shalt call me Ishi; and shalt call me no more Baali. ... 19 And I will betroth thee unto me for ever; yea, I will betroth thee unto me in righteousness, and in judgment, and in lovingkindness, and in mercies. 20 I will even betroth thee unto me in faithfulness: and thou shalt know the LORD.


Application: Isaiah 49-50

49:14 But Zion said, The LORD hath forsaken me


50:1 Thus saith the LORD, Where is the bill of your mother's **divorcement**, whom I have put away? or which of my creditors is it to whom I have sold you? Behold, for your iniquities have ye sold yourselves, and **for your transgressions is your mother put away**.

- Land sold through poverty (Leviticus, Ruth)
- Slavery from poverty (Leviticus)
- Murder (avenger of blood), Numbers
- Childlessness via levirate marriage (Ruth)

"Thy Maker"

When did God make Israel? Consider Isaiah's use of the expression...

44:2 Thus saith the LORD **that made thee** [Heb "thy maker"], and **formed thee** from the womb, *which* will help thee; Fear not, O Jacob, my servant; and thou, Jesurun, whom I have chosen.

44:21 Remember these, O Jacob and Israel; for thou art my servant: I have formed thee; thou art my servant: O Israel, thou shalt not be forgotten of me.

43:1 But now thus saith the LORD that **created thee**, O Jacob, and he that **formed thee**, O Israel, Fear not: for I have redeemed thee, I have called thee by thy name; thou art mine.

43:7 Even every one that is called by my name: for I have **created him** for my glory, I have **formed him**; yea, I have **made him**.

43:21 This people have I **formed** for myself; they shall shew forth my praise. Reference is to the people, or to the Servant. Isaiah draws these notions from Deut 32, Moses' valedictory song exhorting the new nation:

Deu 32:6 Do ye thus requite the LORD, O foolish people and unwise? *is* not he thy father *that* hath bought thee? hath he not **made thee**, and **established thee**? Deu 32:18 Of the Rock *that* begat thee thou art unmindful, and hast forgotten God that **formed thee**.

→ The Exodus, not Gen 1

"The Holy One of Israel"

"The Holy One..."

- Originates in psalms by David's contemporaries (Ps 71:22; 78:41; 89:19)
- Isaiah's favorite title for the Lord
- cf. 6:2-3 Above it stood the seraphims: each one had six wings; with twain he covered his
 face, and with twain he covered his feet, and with twain he did fly. 3 And one cried unto
 another, and said, Holy, holy, holy, is the LORD of hosts: the whole earth is full of his
 glory.

"...of Israel"

- Even the Gentiles must recognize that the God who saves them is first of all Israel's God
- Ruth 1:16 And Ruth said, Intreat me not to leave thee, *or* to return from following after thee: for whither thou goest, I will go; and where thou lodgest, I will lodge: thy people *shall be* my people, and **thy God my God**:
- Ruth 2:11-12 And Boaz answered and said unto her, It hath fully been shewed me, all that thou hast done unto thy mother in law since the death of thine husband: and how thou hast left thy father and thy mother, and the land of thy nativity, and art come unto a people which thou knewest not heretofore. 12 The LORD recompense thy work, and a full reward be given thee of the LORD God of Israel, under whose wings thou art come to trust.
- Compare Paul's exhortation to the Romans (11:18): **Boast not against the branches.** But if thou boast, **thou bearest not the root, but the root thee**.
