Mat 10:5 These twelve Jesus sent forth, and commanded them, saying,	Luk 14:25 And there went great multitudes with him: and he turned, and said unto them,

v. 39, Saving and Losing one's Life/Soul (ψυχη) in the Gospels

Sending the Twelve: Matt 10:39 He that **findeth** his **life** shall **lose** it: and he that **loseth** his **life** for my sake shall **find** it

After Peter's confession and announcement of the passion

Mat 16:25 For whosoever will save his life shall lose it: and whosoever will lose his life for my sake shall find it.

Mar 8:35 For whosoever will save his life shall lose it; but whosoever shall lose his life for my sake and the gospel's, the same shall save it.

Luk 9:24 For whosoever will save his life shall lose it: but whosoever will lose his life for my sake, the same shall save it.

To the disciples after he spoke to the Pharisees about the kingdom of God, Luk 17:33 Whosoever shall seek to save his life shall lose it; and whosoever shall lose his life shall preserve it.

During passion week, Joh 12:25 He that **loveth** his **life** shall **lose** it; and he that **hateth** his **life** in this world shall **keep** it unto life eternal.

v. 39, Saving and Losing one's Life/Soul (ψυχη) in the Epistles

Heb 10:39 But we are not of them who draw back unto **perdition**; but of them that believe to the **saving** of the **soul**.

Saving without Losing

Jam 1:21 Wherefore lay apart all filthiness and superfluity of naughtiness, and receive with meekness the engrafted word, which is able to save your souls. [compare the role of the Word in the new birth, in 1:18]

Jam 5:20 Let him know, that he which converteth the sinner from the error of his way shall save a soul from death, and shall hide a multitude of sins.

1Pe 1:9 Receiving the end of your faith, even the salvation of your souls.

What does ψυχη mean?

Physical Life:

Luk 9:54 And when his disciples James and John saw *this*, they said, Lord, wilt thou that we command fire to come down from heaven, and consume them, even as Elias did? 55 But he turned, and rebuked them, and said, Ye know not what manner of spirit ye are of. 56 For the Son of man is not come to **destroy** men's **lives**, but to **save** *them*.

Something beyond physical life:

Mat 10:28 And fear not them which **kill** the body, but are not able to kill the soul: but rather fear him which is able to **destroy** both soul and body in hell.

Look at the Verbs

Six different word families for "save"

Only three word families for "lose," and all but two instances are from $\sqrt{\alpha}\pi$ 0 λ 0 μ 1

απολλυμι in the LXX: Lev 7:20 **that soul shall be cut off** from his people. (Also 7:21, 25, 27; 17:10; 20:6; cf. 23:30)

→ Losing the soul ~ being separated from the people of God.

How does this relate to the challenge in view in the Fourth Difficulty?

Skewed Triplets in 10:40-42

"Receive"	"Reward"
40 He that receiveth you receiveth me, and he that receiveth me receiveth him that sent me.	
41 He that receiveth a prophet in the name of a prophet	shall receive a prophet's reward;
and he that receiveth a righteous man in the name of a righteous man	shall receive a righteous man's reward.
	42 And whosoever shall give to drink unto one of these little ones a cup of cold water only in the name of a disciple, verily I say unto you, he shall in no wise lose his reward.

Receiving X's Reward: what kind of genitive?

Subjective (the reward that X gives)?

- Elijah and the widow of Zarephath (1 Kings 17)
- Elisha and the great woman of Shunem (2 Kings 4)
- Paul and the house of Onesiphorous (2 Tim 1:16-18)
- → Are these really given by {Elijah, Elisha, Paul}?

Objective (the reward that X will receive)?

3Jo 1:5 We therefore ought to receive such, that we might be fellowhelpers to the truth.

Categories of Believers

- 40, The Twelve ("he that receiveth you")
- 41a, Prophets ~ notable teachers
 - Act 13:1 Now there were in the church that was at Antioch certain **prophets** and teachers;
 - Eph 2:19 Now therefore ye are no more strangers and foreigners, but fellowcitizens with the saints, and of the household of God; 20 And are built upon the foundation of the apostles and **prophets**,
 - Eph 4:11 And he gave some, apostles; and some, **prophets**; and some, evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers;
- 41b, A righteous man ~ "he that is spiritual judgeth all things, yet he himself is judged of no man" (1 Cor 2:15).
- 42, The little ones ~ a disciple, cf. the "little children" of 1 John 2:12, 13.
- → All are to receive and care for one another.

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
