

Structure of Luke 17:20-37





Shortening the Days



Rev 11:2 But the court which is without the temple leave out, and measure it not; for it is given unto the Gentiles: and the holy city shall they tread under foot **forty and two months**. 3 And I will give *power* unto my two witnesses, and they shall prophesy **a thousand two hundred and threescore days**, clothed in sackcloth. Rev 12:14 And to the woman were given two wings of a great eagle, that she might fly into the wilderness, into her place, where she is nourished for **a time**, **and times**, **and half a time**, from the face of the serpent. (cf. Dan 7:25; 12:7)

Daniel's 70th Seven (Sabbatical Period)

Motives for Rejoicing in Persecution

Brings a reward:

Mat 5:11 Blessed are ye, when *men* shall revile you, and persecute *you*, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake. 12 **Rejoice, and be exceeding glad**: [Luke 6:23 "leap for joy"] for **great** *is* **your reward** in heaven: for so persecuted they the prophets which were before you.

Develops spiritual character:

Rom 5:3 And not only *so*, but we **glory** in tribulations also: knowing that **tribulation worketh patience**; Jam 1:2 My brethren, **count it all joy** when ye fall into divers temptations; 3 Knowing *this*, that the trying of your faith worketh **patience**.

A sign of God's trust:

Act 5:41 And they departed from the presence of the council, **rejoicing** that **they were counted worthy** to suffer shame for his name.

Advances the work of the gospel:

2Co 12:10 Therefore I **take pleasure** in infirmities, in reproaches, in necessities, in persecutions, in distresses **for Christ's sake**: for when I am weak, then am I strong.

Col 1:24 Who now **rejoice** in my sufferings **for you**, and fill up that which is behind of the afflictions of Christ in my flesh **for his body's sake**, which is the church:

Summary:

1Pe 4:12 Beloved, think it not strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you, as though some strange thing happened unto you: 13 But rejoice, inasmuch as ye are partakers of Christ's sufferings; that, when his glory shall be revealed, ye may be glad also with exceeding joy. 14 If ye be reproached for the name of Christ, happy are ye; for the spirit of glory and of God resteth upon you: on their part he is evil spoken of, but on your part he is glorified. 15 But let none of you suffer as a murderer, or as a thief, or as an evildoer, or as a busybody in other men's matters. 16 Yet if any man suffer as a Christian, let him not be ashamed; but let him glorify God on this behalf.
