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Baptism with Spirit and Fire

The People: "He shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost and fire"

The Prophecy:

Mal 3:1 the Lord, whom ye seek, shall suddenly come to his temple, ... 2 But who may abide the day of his coming? and who shall stand when he appeareth? for he *is* like a refiner's fire, and like fullers' soap: 3 And he shall sit *as* a refiner and purifier of silver: and he shall purify the sons of Levi, and purge them as gold and silver, that they may offer unto the LORD an offering in righteousness.

The Imagery: with "wheat and chaff," contrast "wheat and tares"...

Mat 13:30 Let both grow together until the harvest: and in the time of harvest I will say to the reapers, Gather ye together first the tares, and bind them in bundles to burn them: but gather the wheat into my barn.

The Promise:

1Co 3:12 Now if any man build upon this foundation gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, stubble; 13 Every man's work shall be made manifest: for the day shall declare it, because it shall be revealed by fire; and the fire shall try every man's work of what sort it is. 14 If any man's work abide which he hath built thereupon, he shall receive a reward. 15 If any man's work shall be burned, he shall suffer loss: but he himself shall be saved; yet so as by fire.

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Fulfilling All Righteousness

What makes the "servant of the Lord" righteous?

Isa 53:11 by his knowledge shall my righteous servant justify many; for he shall bear their iniquities.

How John later characterizes Jesus:

Joh 1:29 The next day John seeth Jesus coming unto him, and saith, Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world.

Compare Nathanael's characterization:

Joh 1:49 Nathanael answered and saith unto him, Rabbi, thou art the Son of God; thou art the King of Israel.

In Type:

The Spirit and the Messiah

Moses \rightarrow Joshua:

Num 27:18 And the LORD said unto Moses, Take thee Joshua the son of Nun, **a man in whom** *is* **the spirit**, and lay thine hand upon him;

Elijah \rightarrow Elisha:

1Ki 19:16 Elisha the son of Shaphat of Abelmeholah shalt thou anoint *to be* prophet in thy room.

2Ki 2:9 And Elisha said, ... let a double portion of thy **spirit** be upon me.

2Ki 2:15 they said, **The spirit of Elijah** doth rest on Elisha.

In Prophecy:

Isa 11:1 And there shall come forth a rod out of the stem of Jesse, and a Branch shall grow out of his roots: 2 And **the spirit of the LORD shall rest upon him**, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the LORD; Isa 42:1 Behold [Jacob] my servant, whom I uphold; [Israel] mine elect, *in whom* my soul delighteth; **I have put my spirit upon him**: he shall bring forth judgment to the Gentiles. [additions from LXX; compare Isa 41:8 But thou, Israel, *art* my servant, Jacob whom I have chosen, the seed of Abraham my friend.]

Isa 61:1-2 **The Spirit of the Lord GOD** *is* **upon me**; because the LORD hath anointed me to preach good tidings unto the meek; he hath sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to *them that are* bound; 2 To proclaim the acceptable year of the LORD, ...

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Two senses of divine sonship in the OT:

- The nation: Exo 4:22 And thou shalt say unto Pharaoh, Thus saith the LORD, Israel is my son, even my firstborn:
- The Messiah:
 - Psa 2:7 I will declare the decree: the LORD hath said unto me, Thou art my Son; this day have I begotten thee.
 - 2Sa 7:14 I will be his father, and he shall be my son.
- Unifying the two: the Servant hourglass


Which is in focus in Matt 1-3?

Mat 2:14-15 When he arose, he took the young child and his mother by night, and departed into Egypt: 15 And was there until the death of Herod: that it might be fulfilled which was spoken of the Lord by the prophet, saying, **Out of Egypt have I called my son**.
