Principle: the Lord is not *canceling* or *modifying* the OT law, but *reinforcing* and *explaining* it.

- "it was said" → The Oral Law (Jewish tradition)
- "it is written" → The Written Law (the OT)

Principle: The Lord is challenging Jewish tradition, not the OT law.

Love your enemies (4 commands)

For oti he is kind to his enemies (2 examples)

For γαρ the sinners do not love their enemies (2 examples)

Motive 1: Be like God

Motive 2: Don't be like the sinners

The Difference between "Child" and "Son"

Gal 4:1 Now I say, *That* the heir, as long as he is a child, differeth

nothing from a servant, though he be lord of all; 2 But is under tutors and governors until the time appointed of the father. 3 Even so we, when we were children, were in bondage under the elements of the world: 4 But when the fulness of the time was come, God sent forth his Son, made of a woman, made under the law, 5 To redeem them that were under the law, that we might receive the adoption of sons. Rom 8:14 For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God. 15 For ye have not received the spirit of bondage again to fear; but ye have received the Spirit of adoption, whereby we cry, Abba, Father. 16 The Spirit itself beareth witness with our spirit, that we are the children of God: 17 And if children, then heirs; heirs of God, and joint-heirs with Christ; if so be that we suffer with him, that we may be also glorified together. 18 For I reckon that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us. 19 For the earnest expectation of the creature waiteth for the manifestation of the sons of God.
