Questions on Psa 69

Next to Psa 22, this is the Psalm most frequently quoted of the Lord Jesus in the NT.

- 1. You might find it interesting to identify the verses that the NT applies to our Lord.
- 2. Is the psalm's primary reference to David and only typologically to the Lord Jesus (e.g., Psa 40, cf. v. 12), or is it a direct reference to the Lord that was only approximately fulfilled in David (e.g., Psa 16:10, cf. Peter's argument in Acts 2)? Be prepared to defend your answer.
- 3. The structure to the psalm appears (to me, at any rate) to turn on the alternation of petition (asking God for something) and statement.
 - a) What kinds of things does he ask God for? (Hint: how is v. 6 different from the other requests?)
- 4. To whom does he make statements? And what do these statement concern?
- 5. Map out which verses are of which sort. Do you notice anything about the relative sizes of the sections? How does the Psalm's relative emphasis shift as it progresses?
- 6. How might you reconcile the imprecatory tone of this Psalm with our Lord's prayer for forgiveness for his persecutors (Luke 23:34)? (Be sure to take into account the NT citation of v. 22.)
