Setting: Dedication of the Second Temple, Ezra 6

The Fifth Book (Pss 107-150) is largely post-exilic, looking back on the exile. Ps 118 presumes existence of the (restored) temple:

19 Open to me **the gates of righteousness**: I will go into them, *and* I will praise the LORD. 20 **This [is the] gate of the LORD**, into which the righteous shall enter.

History of the restored temple:

[month 12], which was in the sixth year of the reign of Darius the king. 16 And the children of Israel, the priests, and the Levites, and the rest of the children of the captivity, kept the dedication of this house of God with joy, 17 And offered at the dedication of this house of God an hundred bullocks, two hundred rams, four hundred lambs; and for a sin offering for all Israel, twelve he goats, according to the number of the tribes of Israel. 18 And they set the priests in their divisions, and the Levites in their courses, for the service of God, which *is* at Jerusalem; as it is written in the book of Moses. 19 And the children of the captivity kept the passover upon the fourteenth *day* of **the first month.**



vv. 10-12, "all nations compassed me about"

Act 4:25 Who by the mouth of thy servant David hast said, Why did the **heathen** rage, and the **people[s]** imagine vain things? 26 The **kings** of the earth stood up, and the **rulers** were gathered together against the Lord, and against his Christ. 27 For of a truth against thy holy child Jesus, whom thou hast anointed, **both Herod**, **and Pontius Pilate**, **with the Gentiles**, **and the people[s] of Israel**, were gathered together, 28 For to do whatsoever thy hand and thy counsel determined before to be done.

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v. 18 "The Lord hath chastened me sore"

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Isa 53:5 But he *was* wounded for our transgressions, *he was* bruised for our iniquities: the **chastisement** of our peace *was* upon him; and with his stripes we are healed.

Heb 5:8 Though he were a Son, yet learned he obedience by the things which he suffered;
