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An Ancient Promise

The promise in Eden:

Gen 3:16 Unto the woman he said, I will greatly multiply thy sorrow and **thy conception**; in sorrow **thou shalt bring forth children**; and thy desire [shall be] to thy husband, and he shall rule over thee. 14 And the LORD God said unto the serpent, ... 15 ... I will put enmity between thee and the woman, and between thy seed and her seed; **it shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt bruise his heel.**

The arrival of the deliverer:

Lk 1:30 And the angel said unto her, Fear not, Mary: for thou hast found favour with God. 31 And, behold, thou shalt **conceive** in thy womb, and **bring forth a son**, and shalt **call his name** JESUS. 32 He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Highest: and the Lord God shall give unto him the throne of his father David: 33 And he shall reign over the house of Jacob for ever; and of his kingdom there shall be no end.

The promise fulfilled:


Heb 2:14 Forasmuch then as the children are partakers of flesh and blood, he also himself likewise **took part of the same** [born of a woman]; that **through death** [his heel was bruised] he might **destroy him** that had the power of death, that is, the devil [he crushed the Serpent's head];

An initial prophecy may be **repeated** down through history,


- sometimes in words and

until the time of the actual fulfillment.





God to Sarah	Elisha to the Shunammite
Ge 17:19 And God said, Sarah thy wife shall bear thee a son indeed; and thou shalt call his name Isaac: and I will establish my covenant with him for an everlasting covenant, [and] with his seed after him.	
Gen 18:10 And he said, I will certainly return unto thee according to the time of life; and, lo, Sarah thy wife shall have a son. And Sarah heard <i>it</i> in the tent door, which <i>was</i> behind him 12 Therefore Sarah laughed within herself, saying, After I am waxed old shall I have pleasure, my lord being old also? 13 And the LORD said unto Abraham, Wherefore did Sarah laugh, saying, Shall I of a surety bear a child, which am old? 14 Is any thing too hard for the LORD? At the time appointed I will return unto thee, according to the time of life, and Sarah shall have a son.	2Ki 4:14 And he [Elisha] said, What then <i>is</i> to be done for her? And Gehazi answered, Verily she hath no child, and her husband is old. 15 And he said, Call her. And when he had called her, she stood in the door. 16 And he said, About this season, according to the time of life, thou shalt embrace a son. And she said, Nay, my lord, <i>thou</i> man of God, do not lie unto thine handmaid. 17 And the woman conceived , and bare a son at that season that Elisha had said unto her, according to the time of life.
