(3:1 the **world** knoweth us not)

3:2-6, The Son **Manifests** Righteousness

3:7-10, The Devil **Opposes** Righteousness

• Sin = family resemblance


(3:9 whosoever is **born of God** doth not commit sin)

Practical Righteousness


Ezk 36:27 And I will put my spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes, and ye shall keep my judgments, and do *them*.

Practical Righteousness and the New Birth




2:29 ... every one that doeth righteousness is born of him.

What is True Righteousness?

Isa 64:6 But we are all as an unclean thing, and all our righteousnesses are as filthy rags;

. . .

Php 3:6 touching the righteousness which is in the law, blameless. 7 But what things were gain to me, those I counted loss for Christ.



3:9 Whosoever is born of God doth not commit sin; ...

3:1, Love and Hatred

Rom 5:8 But God commendeth his **love** toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.

Jhn 15:19 If ye were of the world, the world would love his own: but because ye are not of the world, but I have chosen you out of the world, therefore the world **hateth** you.

Isaiah 64:6

6But we are all as an unclean thing, and all our righteousnesses are as filthy rags; and we all do fade as a leaf; and our iniquities, like the wind, have taken us away

3:2a Beloved, now are we the sons of God

3:3 And every man that hath this hope in him purifieth himself, even as he is pure.


3:4 Whosoever committeth sin transgresseth also the law: for sin is the transgression of the law.

3:5a And ye know that he was manifested to take away our sins;

3:5b and in him is no sin. 3:6 Whosoever abideth in him sinneth not: whosoever sinneth hath not seen him, neither known him. 3:2b and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is.

(1Jn 2:28 And now, little children, abide in him; that, when he shall appear, we may have confidence, and not be ashamed before him at his coming.)

Appear, Manifest (φανερόω faneroō G5319; φανερός faneros G5318)



Acts 26:26 ... this thing was **not done in a corner**


Jhn 18:20 Jesus answered him, I spake **openly** to the world; I ever taught in the synagogue, and in the temple, whither the Jews always resort; and **in secret have I said nothing.**

The Son Manifests Righteousness

we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is

2Co 3:18 But we all, with open face beholding as in a glass the glory of the Lord, are changed into the same image from glory to glory, even as by the Spirit of the Lord.

1Co 13:12 For now we see through a glass, darkly; but then face to face: now I know in part; but then shall I know even as also I am known.



Sin (noun ἁμαρτία *hamartia* G266; verb ἁμαρτάνω *hamartanō* G264) in 1 John

1 John 1: Christ delivers from sin

1Jn 1:7 But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin.

1Jn 2:1 My little children, these things write I unto you, that ye sin not. And if any man sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous: 2 And he is the propitiation for our sins: and not for ours only, but also for the sins of the whole world.

Sin and the Manifestation of Christ

3:4 sin is the transgression of the law [lawlessness]

1Jn 5:17 All unrighteousness is sin.

3:5 manifested to take away our sins

Ezk 36:27 And I will put my spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes, and ye shall keep my judgments, and do them.

Matt 1:21 thou shalt call his name JESUS: for he shall save his people from their sins.

and in him is no sin
