

Chiasm (AB-C-D-C'-B'A'B") in 1:1-6

A: 1:1 Now it came to pass in the days when **the judges** ruled, that there was a **famine** in the land.

B: And a certain man of Bethlehemjudah went to sojourn in the country of Moab, he, and his wife, and his two sons.

2 And the name of the man was Elimelech, and the name of his wife Naomi, and the name of his two sons Mahlon and Chilion, Ephrathites of Bethlehemjudah. [external inclusio] And they came into the country of Moab, and continued there.

C: 3 And Elimelech Naomi's husband died; and she was left, and her two sons.


A': for she had heard in the country of Moab how that the LORD had visited his people in giving them bread.

B': 6 Then she arose with her daughters in law, that she might return from the country of Moab:


B": 7 Wherefore she went forth out of the place where she was, and her two daughters in law with her; and they went on the way to return unto the land of Judah.

Naomi's Overgeneralization

Gen 38:6 And Judah took a wife for Er his firstborn, whose name was Tamar. 7 And Er, Judah's firstborn, was wicked in the sight of the LORD; and the LORD slew him. 8 And Judah said unto Onan, Go in unto thy brother's wife, and marry her, and raise up seed to thy brother. ... 10 And the thing which he did displeased the LORD: wherefore he slew him also. 11 Then said Judah to Tamar his daughter in law, Remain a widow at thy father's house, till Shelah my son be grown: for he said, Lest peradventure he die also, as his brethren did. And Tamar went and dwelt in her father's house. ... 26 And Judah acknowledged them, and said, She hath been more righteous than I; because that I gave her not to Shelah my son.
